#### October 2, 2024 Rustin Movie Screening Social Justice Center (Com-204)

Rustin is the powerful true story of Bayard Rustin, the openly gay Black Civil Rights leader who dedicated his life to a quest for racial equality. He was one of the greatest activists and organizers the world has ever known. He challenged authority, never apologized for who he was, what he believed, or who he loved. Rustin shines a long overdue spotlight on the extraordinary man who, alongside giants like Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Adam Clayton Powell Jr., and Ella Baker, dared to imagine a different world and inspired a movement in a march toward freedom.

Gay USA is the first American feature-length documentary by and about LGBTQIA+ people. Director Arthur J. Bressan, Jr. mobilized camera crews across the country to document the national Gay Freedom Day marches in June of 1977. Gay USA conveys the passion, anger, and defiant optimism of a community under attack.

unexpectedly fought back. It was the first known instance of collective, queer resistance to police intimidation in United States history. Screaming Queens tells the story of this little-known uprising that helped launch a broader fight for human rights in America.



#### October 23, 2024 P.S. Burn This Letter Please Social Justice Center (Com-204)

A box of letters, held in secret for nearly 60 years, ignites a five-year exploration into a part of LGBTQIA+ history that has never been told. The letters, written in the 1950s by a group of New York City drag queens, open a window into a forgotten world where being yourself meant breaking the law and where the penalties for "masquerading" as a woman were swift and severe.
